











This graph shows your responses to Virtual Items for each of the organs indicated. Of most interest are the ones with the out-of-range values.











VERTEBRAE BIOMARKERS



This graph shows your responses to Virtual Items for each of the vertebrae indicated. Of most interest are the ones with the out-of-range values.




TEETH BIOMARKERS




This graph shows your responses to Virtual Items for each of the teeth indicated. Of most interest are the ones with the out-of-range values.

30.70 Autosanguis Therapy

There are many different forms of autosanguis therapy. The most classic form involves drawing venous blood from the patient and re-injecting it immediately without modification. It is injected either subcutaneously, intra-cutaneously or intra-muscularly.

Variations of this technique may include mixing the blood with a homoeopathic or homotoxicological medicine before injection. The blood may also be drawn and enriched with oxygen, ozone or trace elements or be irradiated with ultraviolet light before it is either re-injected intravenously or infused.
